New Sexual Offences Legislation

- Sex must be voluntary
- Sex without consent is rape, even when there are no threats or violence involved
- Entered into force 1 July 2018





Grevio Evaluation Report, Sweden

- "Strong leader in this area"
 - Innovative legislative and policy measures
 - Education, research, National Helpline
 - Local responses vary greatly
 - More effective multi-agency co-operation needed
 - Insufficient resources for the investigation and prosecution of sex crimes and domestic violence cases

National Action Programme for the Management of Victims of Sexual Assault

Governmental commission initiated by the Minister of Justice in order to

- •improve the medical and psychosocial care
- •clarify the health care services' role in the judicial process







"Violence and Health in Sweden"

- National prevalence study
- 10,000 women and 10,000 men
- Exposure to sexual, physical and psychological violence during lifetime
- Links to health
- First report published in 2014

Benefits of identifying abuse

- Adequate help for women subjected to violence can be provided
- Can explain symptoms
- Improved quality of life for the woman
- Less use of health care resources





Positive reactions


Studies show that


The Uppsala Model

Training films for professionals








NCK's out-patient clinic

- Started in 1994
- The first specialist clinic in Sweden for women subjected to violence
- Specialist nurses and doctors (psychiatrist, gynaecologist, GP)
- Cooperates with forensics and the gynaecological emergency unit







Kvinnofridslinjen

- Sweden's National Helpline
- Commissioned by the Swedish Government
- Run by NCK's clinical unit at Uppsala University Hospital
- Started in December 2007
- Over 36 600 calls in 2018 (population in Sweden 10 million)







Professional and easily accessible


- Open 24/7/365
- Professional staff
- Free call, does not appear on the phone bill
- Information about local resources all over Sweden: women's shelters, social services, medical care et cetera
- Access to interpreters
- Website
- Information available in 27 languages




